

**Summary of States that Adopted the Uniform Trust Code and those States’
Treatment of Exception Creditors*
(Sections 503-504)**

(Sections 503 and 504 of the Uniform Trust Code (“UTC”) deal with spendthrift provisions and discretionary trusts. Of the states that adopted the UTC, some states have adopted provisions of UTC Sections 503 and 504 in their entirety, other states have modified 503 and 504 in part by limiting or expanding the scope of exception creditors and other states have reserved or omitted adoption of either 503 or 504, relying instead on either common law or other reasoning)
